Nancy Mills Lee (1927-2015) was born in Shaker Heights, Ohio; she attended Smith College in Northampton, MA. She and her husband, Day Lee, moved to Massachusetts in the 1960s. She acted with the Stockade Players in Deerfield, MA, and the Arena Civic Theater in Greenfield, MA. She also taught drama and English at Bement (Deerfield) and Stoneleigh-Burnham (Greenfield) schools. She sang in the Pioneer Valley Symphony Chorus (Greenfield) for three decades. In addition to her involvement in the performing arts, Lee was a museum guide at Historic Deerfield, author, and researcher. Her monograph, *Samuel Willard: Minister, Educator, Musician, Agent of Change*, was published by the Pocumtuck Valley Memorial Association in 2006.

Lee's papers consist of research files and correspondence, dating from 1981 to 2006.
