

Guide to the Boynton Family Papers PVMA Library

Stephen E. Boynton, son of Stephen Boynton, born March 14, 1803, died May 9, 1907. Married Relief Clark; they had one known son, who is listed below. Boynton resided in West Deerfield where he farmed and grew tobacco. Excused from serving in the military due to a defect in hearing, Stephen lived to be more than 100 years old. He and his wife are buried in the Mill River Cemetery.

Joseph Alonao Boynton, son of Stephen and Relief Clark Boynton, born May 24, 1835, died December 13, 1924. Married Candace C. Quinn of Conway who died in 1900; two children resulted: Lilla and Frederick. Like his father, Joseph was a farmer and tobacco grower who resided in South Deerfield. Buried in Mill River Cemetery with his wife and children.
