Arms ("Nelly") was the only daughter of Richard and Ellen Arms. For a time she and her brother Herbert ran the Arms School in Nyack, N.Y. She later taught at the Rogers School in Lowell, Mass. She lived in Deerfield, caring for the children of her brother, Winthrop, for most of the time after the death of his wife in 1904. During that time she was active in the Arts and Crafts movement producing rugs, baskets, and other craft items. This is a long, almost unbroken, series of her diaries dating from 1888 to 1936.
